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Subject Area 89: Special Education

Category A. Services to Children and Families—Birth to Age Three

89001 Comprehensive Programs Children and Families—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification provide support for the child's functional achievement in multiple domains including learning activities in communication, cognition, self-help, social, emotional and/or physical development. Specific content is based on the child's individual family service plan (IFSP). Courses may be taught by professionals working as a team. *Team members may include, for example, teachers holding licensure in Early Childhood Special Education, Visually Impaired, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Physically Impaired, speech pathologists and occupational or physical therapists. Instruction is provided in the child's home or a center-based setting and to the adult(s) in either of those settings. Adults may include parents, other family members, and/or child care providers.* This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89002 Speech/Language Programs Children and Families—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification provide support for a child's functional achievement in the area of communication development. Learning activities are based on the child's individual family service plan (IFSP). Courses may be taught by a speech-language pathologist. Instruction is provided in the child's home or a center-based setting and to the adult(s) in either of those settings. Adults may include parents, other family members, and/or child care providers. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89003 Dual-Language Programs Children and Families—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the child's native language and English. These courses provide support for development of comprehensive, integrated skills or specific skills. Learning activities are based on the child's individual family service plan (IFSP). Instruction is provided in the child's home or a center-based setting and to the adult(s) in either of those settings. Adults may include parents, other family members, and/or child care providers. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89099 Children and Families Other—Individualized Services

This classification is used when none of the defined Services to Children and Families classifications above describes the local course. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. *(Provide local course description.)*

Category B. Child Services—Ages Three through Kindergarten

89101 Integrated Child Services—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are offered in the child's home or in a regular education early childhood center setting. These courses provide developmental support to a child with a disability. They support functional growth in multiple areas, including communication, cognition and self-help as well as social, emotional and/or physical development. Specific course content is based on the child's individual educational plans (IEP). *Courses in this classification may be taught by professionals working as a team that may include teachers holding licensure in Early*

Childhood Special Education, Visually Impaired, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Physically Impaired, speech pathologists and occupational or physical therapists. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89102 Integrated Child Services (Special Education Setting)—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are offered in a special education classroom setting. These courses provide developmental support to a child with a disability. They support functional achievement in multiple areas, including communication, cognition and self-help as well as social, emotional and/or physical development. Specific course content is based on the child's individual educational plans (IEP). *Courses in this classification may be taught by professionals working as a team that may include teachers holding licensure in Early Childhood Special Education, Visually Impaired, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Physically Impaired, speech pathologists and occupational or physical therapists.* This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89103 Speech/Language Child Services—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are offered in the child's home or in a regular education early childhood center setting. They provide developmental support to a child with communication delays and disabilities. Specific learning activities are based on the child's individual educational plans (IEP). Courses in this classification may be taught by a speech-language pathologist. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89104 Speech/Language (Special Education Setting) Child Services—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are offered in a special education classroom setting. They provide instruction to children with communication delays and disabilities in a group setting that supports functional achievement in the area of communication development. Specific learning activities are based on the individual education plans of the children enrolled in the course. Courses in this classification may be taught by a speech-language pathologist. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89105 Individual Speech/Language Child Services—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification provide instruction to a child with communication delays or disabilities in a one-on-one speech therapy setting. Specific course content is based on the individual education plan of the child. Courses in this classification may be taught by a speech-language pathologist. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89106 Adapted Physical Education Child Services—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification provide support for development of fundamental movement skills, body awareness and control, safety and enjoyment of physical activity. Learning activities are based on the child's individual education plans. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89107 Dual-Language Child Services—Individual Services

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the child's native language and English. These courses provide support for development of comprehensive, integrated skills or specific skills. Learning activities are based on the child's individual education plans. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

89199 Child Services Other—Individualized Services

This classification is used when no defined Child Services classifications above describe the local course. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. *(Provide local course description.)*

Category C. All Others

89999 Special Education Other—Individualized Services

This classification is used when none of the defined special education classifications above describe the local course. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. *(Provide local course description.)*

Subject Area 90: General Early Education Age Appropriate Programs

Category A. Birth to Age Three

90001 General Early Education Birth to Age Three

Courses in this classification are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90002 General Early Education and Special Education Collaboration Birth to Age Three

Courses in this classification are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. These courses are taught by a general education teacher and a special education teacher. Children may be either special education or general education students. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90003 Dual-Language General Early Education Birth to Age Three

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the children's native languages and English. These courses are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90097 General Early Education Birth to Age Three—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject or content areas. Learning activities are designed specifically to meet the child's needs. Intensive home visiting models may find this classification most appropriate. Content of learning activities is aligned to state standards. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90098 General Early Education Birth to Age Three—Child Directed

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject or content areas. Learning activities are designed based on the child's interests and developmental level. Student selects and initiates their own activities from a variety of learning areas prepared by the teacher. This classification must be used to report the Project Based coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90099 General Early Education Birth to Age Three—Other

This classification is used when none of the defined Birth to Age Three classifications above describes the local course. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. *(Provide local course description.)*

Category B. Ages Three through Kindergarten

90101 General Early Education Ages Three through Kindergarten

Courses in this classification are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90102 General Early Education and Special Education Collaboration Ages Three through Kindergarten

Courses in this classification are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. These courses are taught by a general education teacher

and a special education teacher. Children may be either special education or general education students. Specific content is aligned to state standards.

90103 Dual-Language General Early Education Ages Three through Kindergarten

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the children's native languages and English. These courses are an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific content is aligned to state standards.

90197 General Early Education Ages Three through Kindergarten—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject areas. Learning activities are designed specifically to meet the child's needs. Intensive home visiting models may find this classification most appropriate. Specific content is aligned to state standards. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90198 General Early Education Ages Three through Kindergarten—Child Directed

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject areas. Learning activities are designed based on the child's interest and developmental level. Student selects and initiates their own activities from a variety of learning areas prepared by the teacher. This classification must be used to report the Project Based coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90199 General Early Education Ages Three through Kindergarten—Other

This classification is used when no defined Ages Three through Kindergarten classifications above describes the local course. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. (*Provide local course description.*)

Category C. Birth through Kindergarten

90201 General Early Education Birth through Kindergarten

For courses in this classification the students are enrolled in an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90202 General Early Education and Special Education Collaboration Birth through Kindergarten

For courses in this classification the students are enrolled in an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. These courses are taught by a general education teacher and a special education teacher. Children may be either special education or general education students. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90203 Dual-Language General Early Education Birth through Kindergarten

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the children's native languages and English. For courses in this classification the students are enrolled in an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards

90297 General Early Education Birth through Kindergarten—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject areas. Learning activities are designed to meet the specific needs of the child. Intensive home visiting models may find this classification most appropriate. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90298 General Early Education Birth through Kindergarten—Child Directed

Courses in this classification offer instruction in all subject areas. Learning activities are designed based on the child's interests and developmental level. Student selects and initiates their own activities from a variety of learning areas prepared by the teacher. This classification must be used to report the Project Based coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90299 General Early Education Birth through Kindergarten—Other

This classification is used when no defined Birth through Kindergarten classification above describes the local course. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. *(Provide local course description.)*

Category D: All Others

90301 Multiple-Age General Early Education Programs

Courses in this classification are parenting education courses and extend the child's education experiences up to grade three. The children are enrolled in an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90302 Multiple-Age General Early Education Programs-English as a Second Language

Courses in this classification are designed for English Language Learners. The children are enrolled in an age appropriate courses and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90303 Multi-Age General Early Education and Special Education Collaborative

Courses in this classification are parenting education courses and extend the child's education experiences up to grade three. The children enrolled in an age appropriate course and content areas are integrated within the various learning activities. These courses are taught by a general education teacher and a special education teacher. Children may be either special education or general education students. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. Specific course content is aligned to state standards.

90399 General Early Education Age Appropriate Programs—Others

This classification is used when no defined General Early Education program classification above describes the local course. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. *(Provide local course description.)*

Subject Area 91: Other Course Content Classifications

Category A: All Others

91993 Dual-Language Programs—Individualized Services

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the child's native language and English. This classification is used when course content is not covered by the Special Education Dual-Language Individualized Services classifications. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

91994 Dual-Language Programs—Child Directed

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the child's native language and English. This classification is used when course content is not covered by the General Early Education Area Dual-Language Child-Directed classification. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. Student selects and initiates their own activities from a variety of learning areas prepared by the teacher. This classification must be used to report the Project Based coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework.

91995 Dual-Language Course Classification—Other

Courses in this classification are taught in a combination of the child's native language and English. This classification is used when course content is not covered by the General Early Education "Other" classification in the catalogue is appropriate for the local Dual-Language course offered. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. Please try to find an appropriate specific Subject Area "Other" classification before using this one. *(Provide local course description.)*

91996 Individualized Services Course Classification—Other

This classification is used when course content is not covered by the Special Education Individualized Services classifications. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. This classification must be used to report the Independent Study coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. *(Provide local course description.)*

91997 Child-Directed Course Classification—Other

This classification is used when course content is not covered by the General Early Education Child-Directed classifications. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. Student selects and initiates their own activities from a variety of learning areas prepared by the teacher. This classification must be used to report the Project Based coursework type on the Student Record, but may also be used to report Scheduled coursework. *(Provide local course description.)*

91999 Early Education—Other

This classification is used for courses when course content is not covered by the General Early Education "Other" classifications. Specific course content is aligned to state standards. This classification may be used only to report Scheduled coursework on the Student Record. *(Provide local course description.)*
