

## Current Arts Education Requirements: Standards, Credits and Courses

Level	Credits and Courses: Requirements for Students	Credits and Courses: Requirements for Teachers
Elementary and middle schools	Students enrolled in kindergarten through age 17 must receive instruction in the arts ( <a href="#">120A.22</a> ). Students must be offered at least three and required to meet the standards in two arts areas* ( <a href="#">120B.021</a> ).	K-6 <sup>th</sup> grade: Teacher must have the appropriate arts license or elementary generalist license (up to 33% of an elementary generalist's day.) ( <a href="#">PELSB</a> )  7-8 <sup>th</sup> grade: Teacher must have the appropriate arts license. ( <a href="#">PELSB</a> )
High schools	Students must earn 1 arts credit sufficient to satisfy all the arts standards. Students must be offered at least three and required to meet the standards in at least one arts area <sup>1</sup> ( <a href="#">120B.021</a> , <a href="#">120B.024</a> ). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A credit is a student successfully completing an academic year of study or a student mastering the applicable subject matter, as determined by the local school district.</li> <li>To successfully achieve the amount of learning described in the benchmarks of each arts area, MDE recommends that the credit be in a year-long course in single arts area.</li> <li>A CTE course may count: see box to right for requirements.</li> </ul>	Arts Courses: Teacher must have the appropriate arts license. ( <a href="#">PELSB</a> )  CTE courses that count for arts credit ( <a href="#">120B.024</a> , <a href="#">3505.1150</a> ): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Teacher must have a license in CTE.</li> <li>Teacher must have passed the relevant arts MTLE/licensure test.</li> <li>For media arts courses, districts are encouraged to use the visual arts MTLE.</li> <li>The district must ensure that the CTE course meets <b>all</b> standards in an arts area.</li> </ul>

Elementary and middle schools	Students must meet all arts standards and benchmarks at each grade level in two arts areas*. ( <a href="#">120A.22</a> , <a href="#">120B.021</a> ).	<i>See above for course requirements.</i> Standards may be taught in any class. Districts must have a process to evaluate students' progress toward meeting standards. ( <a href="#">120B.11</a> )
High schools	Students must meet all arts standards and benchmarks in at least one arts area*. ( <a href="#">120B.021</a> , <a href="#">120B.024</a> )	<i>See above for credit requirements.</i> Standards may be taught in any class. Districts must have a process to evaluate each student's progress toward meeting standards.
