COMPASS, Collaborative Minnesota Partnerships to Advance Student Success, is a new statewide education system to support student learning recovery. COMPASS is aimed at accelerating student learning by meeting their academic, social-emotional and mental health needs as we continue to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Educators, school staff and school leaders will have new opportunities for professional learning and coaching, along with coordinated support from experts at the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), [Minnesota Service Cooperatives](#) and [Regional Centers of Excellence](#).



COMPASS aligns with Governor Tim Walz's [Due North Education Plan](#) to work together with educators to provide teaching and learning supports, to create better results and experiences for all students. The strategies focus on: closing gaps; ending disparities in access, participation, and representation; serving students of color and Indigenous students, students receiving special education services, and English learners; increasing graduation rates for every student group; and, having more students report that they feel safe and welcome in school.
